



Northside Historic District

- 1. Waterford Historical Museum & Cultural Center**
—1830 Hugh White Homestead at 2 Museum Lane
- 2. Old Champlain Canal Lock 4**
- 3. NYS Dam between Cohoes & Waterford**—created junction for boats to enter Erie Canal at Cohoes Locks through Lock 4
- 4. Town Towpath Park**—accessible by car from Fulton Street off Saratoga Ave/NYS R32
- 5. Old Champlain Canal Trail**
- 6. Riffs of the Mohawk River (Fourth Branch)** - located between Northside Waterford and Second Island (Mill Island)
- 7. Remnants of King’s Hydraulic Power Canal dam, built 1828**—between Northside Waterford and Bock Island and from Bock Island to Peebles Island (Fourth Branch of Mohawk)
- 8. Northside Fire District**—modern building at 85 Saratoga Ave; built on previous site of 1897 Public School No. 2 which used to house the fire department formerly known as Peck House Fire Co.
- 9. Old Peck Hose Fire House**—2 Hill Street—now a private residence; original location of Northside Fire Department
- 10. Old Wesleyen Church**— 108 First Avenue
- 11. Current Wesleyen Church**—75 Grace Street
- 12. Sugarloaf Pond Park**
(Belanger Ave, Columbus Ave, Michaud Ave)
- 13. 116 Saratoga Ave/NYS R32—Second Empire Victorian Architecture (1865-1880)** with Mansard-style roof; served as a Veterans Home; now a private residence

- 14. Highlighted Route of “Millionaire’s Row”** section of Northside Historic District with a variety of architectural styles, mainly from the Victorian era (see #13)
- 15. Historic Section of Waterford Rural Cemetery**—108 Saratoga Ave/NYS R32—internments dating back to late 1700s.
- 16. Old Change Bridge of Old Champlain Canal Route**—bridge would swivel to allow boaters to pass (leaving foot and horse traffic on either side of the route stranded until the bridge was put back into place); now a standard, stationary pedestrian/vehicle bridge
- 17. Lock 3 Parking Area off 9th Street**—closest visitor traffic can get to this lock as it is the location of a NYS Dry Dock and NYS Canal Corporation offices
- 18. Ursula of Switzerland**—31 Mohawk Ave—housed inside a former 19th century ribbon factory since 1972

Additional Areas of Interest

- 19. Peebles Island State Park**
- 20. Cohoes Falls**—park area available for pedestrian viewing on Cohoes side of the falls
- 21. King’s Hydraulic Power Canal**—filled in remnants of this route; now the Mohawk Paper Mill (inaccessible for non-business visitors to the Mill)
